PURPOSE: The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State (ALMBS) has been a program of The American Legion, Department of West Virginia since 1936. ALMBS participants are exposed to the rights, privileges, duties, and responsibilities of a franchised citizen. The training is objective and practical with city, county, and state governments operated by the participants elected to the various offices. Activities include executive, legislative, and judicial sessions, law enforcement presentations, assemblies with a variety of guest speakers, and Americanism presentations. There are also band, chorus, and recreational activities as part of the program.

The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State was created to teach good government through participation. Participants receive instruction and hands on experience in the governmental, political, and legal processes and participate in a variety of “career paths” that include Political, Legal, Banking, Law Enforcement, Journalism (Broadcast & Print) and Homeland Security (National Guard).

BENEFITS: Attendees of ALMBS are eligible to apply for the Samsung Scholarship, if he is a direct descendant of a US wartime veteran, worth up to \$20,000 towards any higher education institution, including but not limited to, state, private, and technical institutions. All graduates are also eligible for \$30,000 in college scholarship to Wabash College in Crawfordsville, IN. ALMBS attendees also receive extra merit points toward admission to all US Military Service Academies. Participants also have the ability to receive three (3) hours of college credit in leadership provided by Clemson University. ALMBS has verified with the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission (HEPC) that the credits will be accepted to all instate institutions of Higher Education. Attendees also become a member of an elite group of individuals that have graduated from “A Week That Shapes A Lifetime!”

COST: The entire cost for one boy to attend The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State (ALMBS) is \$200.00. A local American Legion post(s) or sponsor(s) they are able to obtain usually pay the application fee. ALMBS is always looking for sponsors and perhaps you may have some civic group(s), individual(s) or business(s) in your community that would be willing to underwrite the cost of sending a boy, or boys, to ALMBS. If so, please contact your local American Legion Post or American Legion Department of West Virginia Headquarters at 1-888-534-4667. An interested applicant may locate his own sponsor or he and/or his family may pay the \$200.00 fee, which covers lodging and meal expenses at the WVU Jackson’s Mill facility. The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State (ALMBS), Inc. is a non-profit 501(C)(3) tax-exempt organization and any donation to ALMBS, Inc. is tax deductible as allowed by applicable law.

QUALIFICATIONS: All eligible candidates must:

1. Be a member of the male enrollment of the Junior Class;
2. Have a 3.0 grade point average on a four-point scale or its equivalent OR a grade point average of no less than 2.75 AND have been determined to be *exceptionally outstanding* in the areas listed in item 3 below, (Note: schools should use the most current cumulative grade point average as of October 1, 2012);
3. Have demonstrated outstanding qualities in the areas of school activities, community activities, and character;
4. Have never attended a Boys State Program previously;
5. Be a citizen of the State of West Virginia OR attend a High School in West Virginia; and
6. Have no potential conflicts with the ALMBS dates of June 9, 2013 –June 15, 2013.

ALMBS is open to those meeting the above requirements regardless of race, creed, or national origin.

PROCEDURE: It is requested that the High School Principal/Counselor(s) provide ALMBS with a list of all students who meet the qualifications by completing the attached form and return it to **The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State, c/o Director Jim Davis, P.O. Box 3191, Charleston, West Virginia 25332, as soon as possible, but no later than December 10, 2012.** Please make this once in a lifetime opportunity available to ALL of your students who meet the QUALIFICATIONS by listing their names and contact information on the enclosed form(s). *Please make a copy for your records and forward a copy to your local American Legion Post.*

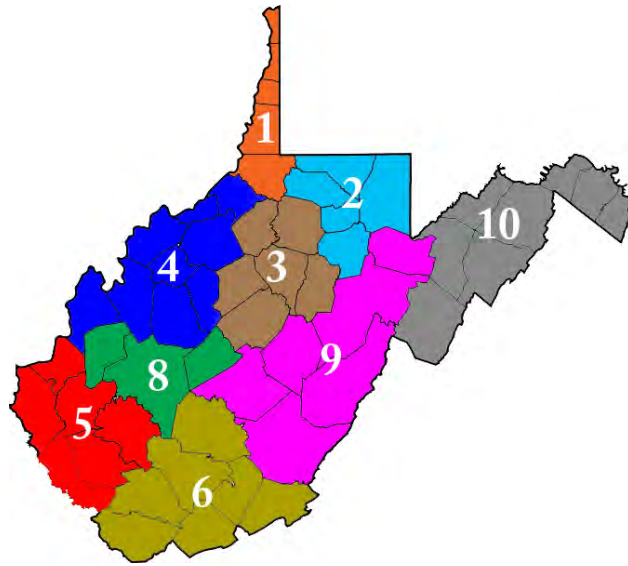
Please remember that the enclosed “ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES” form is not an application. We will provide application information once the candidates have been identified from the enclosed form(s). The American Legion will screen the applicants and select those for admission. Unfortunately, because of the size of the facilities at WVU Jackson’s Mill and the number of sponsors that the local American Legion Posts are able to obtain, we cannot guarantee that every boy that you list will be able to attend.

Do not list anyone who does not have all of the above qualifications. It has been proven that candidates who possess the above qualifications have a better chance of adjusting to The American Legion Mountaineer Boys State program and will be of value to the recommending school and community upon their return. *All eligible candidates, who apply for admission, will be asked to commit to participate for the entire duration of the ALMBS.*
