

## **The American Legion Boys State Fire Department**

This morning, the Mountaineer Boys state OES had their first training session at the fire academy, where they performed some drills to get ready and prepared for action the rest of the week.

The first drill the fire academy performed was the doll house smoke drill, where the fire chief lit a fire at the bottom of a doll house to show how smoke moves and how to detect and find a fire by watching the smoke. They also used thermal guns to see the hottest parts of a burning building and the best point to enter a building. The fire chief also explained how to trap a fire by shutting doors and cutting the fire off from getting oxygen, which doesn't allow a fire to grow.

The second drill the fire academy performed was the helicopter drill, where the OES had to extinguish a fire that had exploded out of a downed helicopter that had crashed. The crew had to work as a team, with one person aiming for the hose and the others holding down the hose.

While at the fire academy, they also showed us how to put on all the needed gear and what each piece of gear does, and they demonstrated how to turn on the fire trucks.





**Chatting with the Director**

Something citizens do not realize is all the work that goes on behind the scenes. To gain more insight into this, ALMBS Staff sat down with the director of WVU Jackson's Mill, David Snively.

The interview was opened up by asking Snively what work he has to do behind the scenes to prepare for American Legion Mountaineer Boys State (ALMBS). Shockingly, he said this was pretty easy since the American Legion gives Jackson's Mill a detailed schedule of what they need and when.

"We start about two weeks out before (citizens) arrive to get all the food ordered, get all the linens ordered and get all the equipment and things you need to have a successful camp before (citizens) get here," said Snively.

Snively was asked what other camps are coming in here after ALMBS and what he has to do to prepare for them.

"It's the same kind of process. (Jackson's Mill) knows in advance what they're going to need," Snively stated. The whole place gets cleaned for the next camp coming to Jackson's Mill. Some of the groups that will be here following ALMBS are 4-H camps, Junior Firefighters Camp, county camps, and band camps.

Snively gave his perspective on how Boys State differs from the other camps held at Jackson's Mill.

"(ALMBS's) focus is a little different with leadership and civics that other 4-H camps kind of incorporate that but not to the extent that (ALMBS) does," Snively explained.

Snively then went on to talk about his favorite thing to do at Jackson's Mill. He likes to run the Gristmill and grind the corn. He also enjoys walking around Jackson's Mill and seeing how the different camps use the facilities.

Shively was appointed director on July 1, 2021. Before that he served as interim director starting in December, 2020. ALMBS citizens agree that WVU Jackson's Mill is a great place for youth activities and with Snively in control it is well managed.

#### **DMV** Information

Earlier this morning, we had to head over to the DMV to ask some questions about what the citizens of Boys State can obtain there, and we got to speak with Jeff Rymen, who was overseeing the operation. The first question we asked was how citizens can obtain a driver's license. Jeff answered that all citizens are to make their way to the Main Pavilion next to the WV building. There, they had to take a 10-question test to pass 70%. You are charged a 25-dollar fee when you pass and obtain your driver's license.

The next question we asked the clerk was how citizens get an inspection done for their vehicle. He said that the state police handled inspections. We asked how citizens obtain vehicle registration. He said it was a part of the same process as the inspection.

The final question we asked was how the citizens are supposed to obtain insurance on their vehicles. He told us that they chose not to do insurance this year because they don't have enough staff to handle that.

After we finished all our questions for him, he told us that the DMV would be open to citizens during the morning and afternoon activities on Wednesday and from morning to evening on Thursday.

We also took some time to stop by the DNR office to ask them some questions, and we spoke to Landon Utt. The first question we asked them was how citizens obtain a hunter's license. Landon answered that the DNR officers report back to their cabins. The citizen must take a test, and if they pass they are given a card to put their names on. The DNR officers signed it, and he said that you go to the DMV to obtain one.

We also asked him about the boating license, to which he answered that it was the same as the hunting license

We asked him what his views were on leadership and how do you become a successful leader. Warner said, "You have to get yourself squared away and follow Stephen Covey's 7 Habits of Highly Effective People: Be proactive, begin with the end in mind, put things first, think Win-win, seek first to understand, then to be understood, synergize, and sharpen the saw." He continued to talk about how you have to find your mission and then be able to finish that mission to the best of your ability. We then inquired about his job as the Secretary of State.

He talked about how he is the Chief Election Officer overseeing elections and works closely with all 55 county clerks. He also discusses the business and licensing aspects of the job. He stated in his office, "It is easier than ever to start and run a business here in West Virginia." The final question we asked him was what he likes so much about the boys' state and why he keeps coming back to speak. He said, "I love it. With my experiences here and the friendships I made, I love it. This is how I keep connected with the youth of this state."

West attended ALMBS as a citizen in 1955 as a nationalist in Gilmer cottage. The skills that West learned at AlMBS stayed with him throughout his life. He carried these skills everywhere he went, especially leadership. One can see this throughout his college career and his 14 year NBA career.
